

What is NorthCare Substance Abuse CDR ? (Central Diagnostic and Referral)



The NorthCare Substance Abuse CDR is an agency committed to serving low income residents of the Eastern Upper Peninsula, and residents with Medicaid throughout the entire UP. The goal of the CDR is to assist individuals in obtaining substance abuse treatment by providing financial assistance, or approval of their Medicaid benefit.

Alcohol and chemical dependency is recognized as a primary, chronic, and progressive disease that can be successfully treated with appropriate identification and treatment.

The CDR's role is to assess the appropriate level of care needed, recommend treatment service, and refer the individual to a participating Substance Abuse Provider.

Your First Step to Getting Treatment...How to Access the NorthCare CDR

If you have never received Substance Abuse services, contact one of the Providers listed in this brochure. Tell them you would like to make an appointment for Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment.

How Will I Pay For Treatment?

Clients are assessed for funding needs based on income, residence, and clinical need. People who meet the requirements or are on Medicaid can receive funding for substance abuse treatment in the appropriate treatment setting. When scheduling an appointment with an outpatient substance abuse provider, ask if you are eligible for financial assistance through the NorthCare Substance Abuse CDR.

Alcohol, Medication & Drugs And Older Adults

Many older adults turn to alcohol and medication following:

- The death of a loved one
- A divorce
- Retirement

Substance and alcohol abuse by older adults often goes undetected because:

- It is mistaken for medical or psychiatric conditions such as depression, insomnia, frequent falls, and poor nutrition.
- Older adults are less likely to get in trouble with the law.
- There is no one around to notice the severity of the problem.

When family and friends can no longer deny the problem, they attempt to control the situation by:

- Rationing alcohol and medication.
- Looking for hidden bottles.
- Maintaining day to day chores such as grocery shopping, cleaning, paying bills.

All these things are helpful, but none solves the problem for long.
